New Road Ditch Drainage Review February 21, 2014

- 1. Karen talked to Representative Smyk earlier in the week regarding the ditch
 - a. Nothing can be done because the ditch is tidal
 - b. If the pipes get fully clogged and no longer drain contact Rep. Smyk
 - c. Possible strategy We could characterize the already clogged pipes as a disaster waiting to happen, e.g. flooding New Road during the next nor'easter. It's in everyone's best interest for the state (DelDot) to take proactive, preventive measures now, rather than waiting.
- 2. Rep. Smyk called Jessica Watson and asked her to meet with Karen to review the New Road ditch.
- 3. Rep. Smyk also called DNREC and asked that Karen be contacted to review the problem
- 4. Lots of "trash" in the ditch
 - a. Karen picked up 5 bags of trash on March 24. Additional cleanup is needed.
- 5. Ditch does not appear to have any choke points.
- 6. Reviewed the pipes moving the water into Canary Creek
 - a. Pipes are at least 60% clogged now
 - b. Canary Creek water will flow into the ditch during high water. On both ends of the pipes, and water flow was visible; therefore, the pipes are currently draining. Even if the pipes were 100% clear, the water level in the ditch would not go down.
 - c. The standing water in the ditch cannot be eliminated because the water is part of tidal Canary Creek.
 - d. Looking at the pipes, the water level appeared to be the same height on both sides of the pipes therefore, it appears the pipes are draining
 - e. We could visibly see water moving from the ditch into the creek
- 7. The portion of the ditch by the outflow is considered wet lands
 - a. The entire ditch may be wetlands
- 8. Ideas were batted around of how to get the water out of the ditch
- 9. Best course of action is to keep the pipes clear
 - a. Remove large debris from the ditch periodically
- 10. Jessica is going to do some investigation regarding the New Road ditch
 - a. Who owns the ditch?
 - b. Why was the outflow created with pipes?
- 11. Sussex Conservation offers applying for financial help to correct stormwater drainage problems for half the cost, up to \$5,000

- a. Jessica will send the form
- b. Not sure what we can do since we cannot fix the drainage problem with the ditch because it is tidal and considered wetlands.

New Road Drainage Ditch – Meeting with Solitude Lake February 21, 2014

- 1. Reviewed the drainage pipes from the end of the ditch into Canary Creek
- 2. Recapped meeting with Jessica (documented above)
- 3. Phragmite in the outflow is a problem
 - a. Will eventually cause a choke point
 - b. Phragmite in HOA wetlands is excessive
 - c. We need to keep the phragmite away from the inflow and outflow
- 4. John recommended a standard clearing
 - a. Remove green briars, trees in the highlands to be able to get equipment back to the drain pipes
 - i. Tree roots could be causing problems to the pipes
 - b. Clear the silt at the beginning and end of the pipes
 - c. May help the water flow better
 - d. In the end, this will not fix the ditch drainage problem
 - e. Ditch is tidal and considered wetlands
 - f. Cost to conduct standard clearing and some sediment removal
 - i. \$2,860 (charge for one full 8 hour day)
 - ii. Work estimated to take 6 hours. If 6-hour job could be piggybacked with another small project (not necessarily ours) on the same day, cost could be brought down to \$2,000. Scheduling would have to be at Solitude's convenience.
- 5. NOAA website will provide high water elevation
- 6. DNREC website will provide elevations
- 7. Keith Ruby Landmark Engineering to help navigate Flood Maps website
- 8. If the HOA attempts to get government help for the New Road ditch drainage we should mention "In Kind Services" as part of the application

- a. Can tell us who owns the New Road ditch
- 10. Jim H. brought up flood maps addresses and lot numbers do not correspond correctly

Brief meeting with Tim, Ed, Sabatino and Karen

- 1. Tim is going to see if we can secure a Roto Rooter service to see if the pipes are clear
- 2. Sabatino would like to see the green briars cleared to the drainage pipes and along the New Road ditch by his property
 - a. Sabatino is leaving for a month next week
 - b. Growing season begins in March/April
 - c. Follow up in October/November 2014 to see if we can secure volunteers for the clearing.
